

CHAMPION OF PROGRESS

H.E Dr. Nkosazana Clarice Dlamini Zuma is a towering figure in South African and global politics, renowned for her unwavering dedication to social justice, public health, and inclusive governance. Born on January 27, 1949, in Natal, South Africa, she emerged from a family deeply committed to education and activism. Her father, Willibrod Gweva, a teacher, instilled in her a sense of duty to her community, while her uncle Stephen Dlamini's activism in the African National Congress (ANC) inspired her to envision a future free from the shackles of apartheid.

The queen of H.E. Dr. Nkosazana Dlamini Zuma's life, her mother, who not only nurtured her but also imparted invaluable lessons on resilience, unwavering commitment, and relentless dedication. From her earliest days, she absorbed the profound wisdom of her mother, internalizing the essence of perseverance in adversity and the significance of staying dedicated to noble causes. This maternal influence was a guiding force throughout her journey, shaping her leadership style and reinforcing the core values of integrity and service that define her impactful career in politics and public service.

As a young student, her journey into activism began during her time at Adams College, where she completed her high school education. Her involvement with the Black Consciousness Movement and the South African Students' Organisation reflected her burgeoning passion for equality and freedom. In 1971, she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in zoology and botany from the University of Zululand, later pursuing her medical studies at the University of Natal. The tumultuous political climate of the 1970s propelled her into exile, where she continued her medical studies in the United Kingdom. Graduating with an MBChB from the University of Bristol in 1978, she immersed herself in ANC activism, becoming the chairperson of the ANC Youth Section in Britain and advocating tirelessly for the anti-apartheid cause across Europe.

Her return to Africa saw her contribute significantly to healthcare and activism. She worked as a paediatric

officer in Swaziland and completed a diploma in tropical child health from Liverpool University's School of Tropical Medicine. Her commitment to public health and social justice remained unwavering, leading her to establish the Health Refugee Trust, a British non-governmental organization, and work for the ANC Health Department in Lusaka, Zambia. With the unbanning of the ANC in 1990 and South Africa's transition to democracy, her role expanded into governance and leadership. She played pivotal roles in the post-apartheid government, serving as Minister of Health under President Nelson Mandela, Minister of Foreign Affairs under H.E. Presidents Thabo Mbeki and Kgalema Motlanthe, and Minister of Home Affairs under H.E. President Jacob Zuma. Her tenure as Minister of Health was marked by groundbreaking initiatives to combat HIV/AIDS and improve healthcare access for all South Africans.

Internationally, her leadership was recognized as she chaired the African Union Commission from 2012 to 2017, becoming the first woman to hold this prestigious position. Her tenure focused on advancing continental integration, promoting gender equality, and addressing critical issues such as conflict resolution and economic development. Returning to South Africa, she continued her legacy of public service, holding key ministerial positions under H.E. President Cyril Ramaphosa's administration. As Minister in the Presidency responsible for Women, Youth, and Persons with Disabilities, she remains a champion of empowerment and inclusivity.



ABOUT THE HOSTING CITY ADDIS ABABA

Addis Ababa, Ethiopia's capital and Africa's Diplomatic capital, and home of the African Union Commission stands at the crossroads of diplomatic, political, economic, cultural, and tourism activities, serving as the vibrant heart of the nation. Nestled at the base of Mount Entoto, it commands an elevation of 2,355 meters, earning the distinction of being Africa's highest city. Encompassing an expansive area of 527 square kilometers, the city's dynamic urban landscape is home to around 4 million inhabitants, reflecting a cosmopolitan character and a population known for its diversity and dynamism.



ECONOMIC PROFILE OF ADDIS ABABA

Economy: Addis Ababa functions as Ethiopia's economic powerhouse, hosting a substantial share of the nation's enterprises and industries. As a financial, insurance, telecommunication, and infrastructure hub, the city attracts a diverse range of businesses spanning building materials, textiles, food processing, and leather production. Notably, Merkato, Africa's largest outdoor market, pulsates with commercial activity, while the city's strategic role as a distribution center for commodities such as coffee, grain, and tobacco underscores its significance in regional trade and commerce.

The city's economy has undergone remarkable growth, emerging as a leading force among Ethiopian cities. Over the past two decades, a shift towards development-oriented programs and privatization has fueled this economic expansion. Initiatives like the Office for Revision of Addis Ababa's Master Plan (ORAAMP) and the National Urban Planning Institute (NUPI) have played vital roles in analyzing the city's economic status. As of 2022, Addis Ababa contributes a significant 29% to Ethiopia's urban GDP and 20% to national urban development, marking a substantial economic footprint.

However, this rapid growth has not been without challenges. Addis Ababa grapples with issues such as infrastructure gaps, transportation constraints, service delivery challenges, youth unemployment, and displacement problems. Despite these hurdles, the city's economic trajectory remains positive, supported by the continuous efforts of both the government and the private sector.

In 1994, trade and commerce, manufacturing, and public administration were leading employment sectors in Addis Ababa, reflecting the city's diverse economic activities. The city has actively sought collaboration with international organizations like the World Bank Group to enhance its economic resilience and address urban development challenges.


